1. Policy to define student dress code

1.1. Objective:

The objective of this policy is the following

1. Define purpose for dress code enforcement.
2. Define unacceptable student dress at the Sheridan Japanese School, and all school related activities.
3. Define procedures when student dress does not comply with policy.

1.2. Purpose for dress code enforcement

Our students are a reflection of our school. Student dress sets the tone for the learning environment, and there is a direct relationship between student dress and acceptable standards of conduct. The SJS dress code is designed to allow for student comfort while maintaining an environment conducive to learning and appropriate for the educational setting.

1.3. Unacceptable dress

Unacceptable dress includes, but is not limited to:

1. hats, hoods, bandannas, sunglasses, goggles, combs, etc. on the head
2. boxer shorts, pants with holes or rips above fingertip level, etc.
3. any clothing article which displays obscene and/or derogatory words, pictures, or designs and/or that conveys a sexually suggestive remark and/or that depicts alcohol, tobacco, drugs, or violence.
4. clothing that is revealing, transparent, and/or exposes the midriff, navel, cleavage, or underwear; shorts, skirts, and dresses must be fingertip length or longer; tank tops must have straps with at least 3-finger width and not be cut too low under the arms; etc. In addition, appropriate footwear must be worn at all times. Athletic shoes must be worn for P.E.

1.4. Procedure for dress code non-compliance

Appropriate clothing will be supplied for students who come to school inappropriately dressed. Further violations of the dress code will result in a parent conference.
